Client Rights

When you receive any type of service for mental illness, alcohol or drug abuse or a developmental disability you have the following rights under WI Statute sec 51.61(1) and HFS 94 of the WI Administrative Code.

- The right to confidentiality, unless release of information is permitted by law.
- The right to be treated with dignity and respect.
- The right to have staff make fair and reasonable decisions about your care.
- The right to be free from discrimination on the basis race, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion or disability.
- The right not to be made to work.
- The right to make personal decisions, unless you've been found legally incompetent.
- The right to use your own money.
- The right not to be filmed, taped or photographed without your informed written consent.
- The right to prompt and adequate treatment.
- The right to participate in the planning of your treatment.
- The right to be informed of the type of treatment and care, including treatment alternatives and possible side effects.
- The right to refuse treatment or medication. (unless it is needed in an emergency to prevent injury or harm to you or others).
- The right to be free from unnecessary or excessive treatment or medication including psychosurgery or experiemental research.
- The right to the least restrictive treatment.
- The right to information regarding the costs of treatment.
- The right to review your records.
- The right to challenge the accuracy of records.
- The right to go to court if you believe you rights were violated.
